

Position Statement of Emerson Motor Company Concerning the "Buy American" Provision of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009

On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed Public Law 111-5 referred to as the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, or ARRA. Section 1605(a) of the ARRA contains a "Buy American" provision mandating that all iron, steel and manufactured products used in ARRA-funded public building and works projects be produced in the United States (subject to certain exceptions). However, in several key respects, the interim rule issued by the Civilian Agency Acquisition and the Defense Acquisition Councils and the guidance issued by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) have provided for application of the Buy American provision in a somewhat restrained manner.

While the Buy American provision of the ARRA requires all iron and steel for use as construction material to have all manufacturing processes take place in the U.S., the guidance states that this requirement does <u>not</u> apply to iron and steel used as components or subcomponents of other manufactured construction materials. Further "manufactured goods" are considered produced in the United States when it results from processing into a specific form and shape or combining of raw material into a property different from the individual raw materials, and that processing/combining occurs in the United States. Even more important, the interim rule and OMB guidance further state there is no requirement with regards to the origin of components or subcomponents in manufactured goods, as long as the manufacture of the goods occurs in the United States. Thus, for purposes of the ARRA, construction material will acquire domestic origin status when manufactured in the United States without regard to the origin of its components.

Emerson Motor Company, a division of Emerson Electric Co., St. Louis, Missouri, is proud to let you know that motors manufactured by our Mena, Arkansas facility sold and shipped within the United States comply with the Buy American requirements of Section 1605 of the ARRA. More specifically, this includes vertical motors 100 HP and above and modified production Vertical Holloshaft and Vertical Solid Shaft motors 40 HP and above. In addition, based on the guidance issued to date, imported motors sold by Emerson Motor Company can be included in a "manufactured good" in the United States without effecting compliance with the Buy American requirement of the ARRA.

As of this date, the final rule has not been issued concerning the Buy American provisions contained in Section 1605 of the ARRA. Thus any final determination regarding the ARRA must necessarily wait for the issuance of Final Rules.² Emerson Motor Company will continue to monitor the guidance on the ARRA to support customer's requests for motors used in ARRA-funded public building and works projects.

¹ Customers interested in purchasing a specific Emerson motor for use in an ARRA funded project should contact their Emerson Motor Company representative for confirmation that the final "manufactured good" falls within the requirements of Section 1605.

² Certain U.S. government agencies may also impose further requirements on the distribution and use of their ARRA funds.
